Getting Started

There are two methods of theme installation. Normally you should be able to install your theme through the Appearance menu of the WordPress dashboard, but you might occasionally have to install the theme manually by using FTP.

Please click here for instruction on how to install a theme through the WordPress Admin or via FTP.

Installing a Skin

The theme comes with a set of predefined skins, namly, black and white. You can install these by going The Foundry > Welcome. In the welcome screen click 'Upload a Foundry Pack' and thereafter thereafter click 'Upload to Install'.

Demo Content Troubleshooting

1. I get a bunch of 'Failed to Import' errors?

Make sure that you have activated the theme as this error commonly occurs because it's trying to load posts or taxonomies of custom post types do not yet exist or that you did not check the box saying 'download and import file attachments'.

2. It just keeps loading but nothing happens and nothing gets imported?

- Try editing your wp-config.php file to:

```
define('WP_MEMORY_LIMIT', '96M');
```

Permalink Troubleshooting

If you get an error when setting your permalinks to 'Post Name' it could be that your install does not generate a .htaccess file or that it does not write the new rules onto your existing .htaccess file. To rectify this you can try to change file permissions. To do this chmod the .htaccess file to 666 and edit the file.

Updating the Theme

Updating the Theme

NOTE: Following these steps will ensure that your data stays intact. However, if you have made any CSS changes to the theme, please make sure that they have been entered directly in the Foundry CSS Editor or in an external stylehseet imported in the Foundry CSS Editor . **Any changes to template files will be overwritten in an update.**

Step 1. Delete Current Version

Go Appearance > Themes. Activate one of the default themes that comes with WordPress. Then click the 'Delete' link under your uploaded theme.

Step 2. Upload the New Version

Go Appearance > Themes. Click 'Install Themes' > 'Upload' and select your the theme folder. Once uploaded click 'Activate'.

Importing a Stylesheet

You can import your own stylesheet directly in the Foundry > CSS Editor. This is done as follows:

@import url(http://yourdomain.com/fontfolder/bebasneue.css);

NOTE: Make sure to enter the correct URL depending on where you have uploaded the stylesheet.

Theme Customization

You can control all aspects of your theme through the Foundry Theme Panel. However, if you want to customize the theme further and implement substantial changes, we highly recommend creating a child theme. You can read more on how to create Child themes here. The benefit of creating a child theme is that it will give you much greater flexibility as you add or remove scripts and as well as add custom functions. Creating a child theme will also ensure that any changes you made to core scripts will stay intact when updating the theme.

Homepage

Front Page Settings

If you are using a static homepage (i.e. with a homepage slider) make sure to have set the "static front page" option under Settings > Reading.

Homepage Layout Options

Your front page can take one of the following layouts:

- 1. Regular (fixed with of 870px)
- 2. Full Width Media (sliders, video or image will span across the screen)
- 3. Full Width Index Portfolio Grid (full width portfolio grid)

The above options are set in Foundry > General under "Select Front Page Layout"

Homepage Slider

The homepage full width slider is created in the same manner that the full width slider for projects are created.

Adding Recent Projects

To add recent projects to the front page go Foundry > General and set "Display Latest Projects on Front Page" to "on". The last eight projects will be displayed on the front page and you can choose to display them in a full width or fixed width grid. This is also set under Foundry > General.

Setting Recent Posts

To add recent projects to the front page go Foundry > General and set "Display Latest Post on Front Page" to "on". The last three posts will be displayed on the front page. Posts can only be displayed in a fixed grid of three columns.

Creating a Project

Description

This section describes how to create a project.

Step.1

Go Portfolios > Add New.



Step.2

Give your project a Title.

Step.3

Set a featured Image. This is the image that will appear in the Portfolio Grid. For more information on how to set a featured image please see Featured Project Image.

Step.4

Scroll down to the bottom of the page and enter a 'Display Title' if you wish to use one. You can use this field to customize the project title using spans. Below is a working example:

Step.5

Choose page layout, you have the option of three different layouts, namely:

- 1. Default (with featured image, video or slider that span 870px)
- 2. Full Width Featured Meda (with featured image or slider that spans across the entire window)
- 3. Without Featured Media (if you want to use short codes instead)

Step.6

Set the thumbnail caption that appears on rollover under "Portfolio Index Thumbnail Caption". If left blank, the rollover graphic set in Foundry >Colors > Shortcodes under "Lightbox & Thumbs: Rollover Graphic" will appear instead.

Repeat steps 3 to 5 for each slide you want to add to the slider. Keep in mind that you will need to have added two or more slides to activate the slider. Once done, close the modal and click on 'Publish'

Featured Full Width Project Slider

Adding Slides

Description

This section describes how to add slides to full width slider. This is valid for both the homepage slider and full width project slider.

Slider Image Sizes

Images used in the slider will automatically scale to fit width of the viewport if the option "Crop to Fit" is set to "On" in The Foundry Theme Options Panel. Images used for the demo are approximately 1500px * 800px in size and around 200kb each. All slides do not need to be the same size.

NOTE: Slides need to be associated with the homepage or project. They should therefore be uploaded directly to the page using the media uploader and not in the media library.

Adding Slides

This section describes how to add and style captions for the homepage and the full with project slider.

Step.1

Click 'Add Media' .



Step.2

Click 'Upload Files' then 'Select Files' and select all slides you want to appear in the full width slider.

Go through each image and a add caption and make sure that 'Display Opt.' is set to 'Display in Featured Slider'. For caption styles and examples please see Full Width Media Caption Types & Examples. Once done, close the modal.



NOTE: If only one image is set to 'Display in Featured Slider' the slider controls will be hidden and the slider will display a single slide. If more than one image is set to 'Display in Featured Slider' the slider and controls will be activated and serve as a regular slider.

Set page layout to 'Full-width Slider'.



Step.5

Click Publish. Repeat Step 1. to Step 5. to add additional slides.

Description

This section describes how reorder slides for the homepage and the project sliders.

Full Width Media Caption Types and Examples

Description

This section describes how to add and style captions for the homepage and the full with project slider.

Usage

Captions are created using the [epicslider_caption] shortcode which is entered into the caption field in the media uploader. For example:

[epicslider_caption caption_type="caption-name" caption_position="position" caption_width="numeric"] [span class="size-1"]A title[/span] Additional text [/epicslider_caption]

Adding a Caption

Caption Types

The slider offers five types of captions:

- 1. Boxed Background (entered as: boxed-background)
- 2. Elegant (entered as: elegant)
- 3. Impact (entered as: impact)
- 4. Single Border (entered as: single-border)
- 5. Striped (entered as: striped)

The caption type is specified using the attribute "caption_type". For example:

[epicslider_caption caption_type="elegant"] [span class="size-1"]A Title[/span] Additional text [/epicslider_caption]

Positions



Each caption can take the following positions:

- 1. Top Left (entered as: top-left)
- 2. Center Left (entered as: center-left)
- 3. Bottom Left (entered as: bottom-left)
- 4. Top Right (entered as: top-right)
- 5. Center Right (entered as: center-right)
- 6. Bottom Right (entered as: bottom-right)
- 7. Center (entered as: center)
- 8. Bottom Center (entered as:bottom-center)
- 9. Top Center (entered as:top-center)

The caption position is specified using the attribute "caption_position". For example:

[epicslider_caption caption_position="top-left"] [span class="size-1"]A Title[/span] Additional text [/epicslider_caption]

Sizes

You can add caption titles using the span shortcode and variate the size using size classes "size-1" to "size-6". For example:

[epicslider_caption caption_position="top-left"] [span class="size-1"]A Title[/span] [span class="size-2"]A Title[/span] [span class="size-3"]A Title[/span]

Adding Background Video

Description

This section describes how to add a fullscreen background video. The steps described below are valid for both the homepage and projects.

Usage

Background videos are created using the [epicslider_background_video] shortcode which is entered into the caption field in the media uploader. For example:

```
[epicslider_background_video id="fs1" mp4_src="http://yourdomain/yourvideo.mp4"
webm_src="http://yourdomain/yourvideo.webm"
ogg_src="http://yourdomain/yourvideo.ogv"]
```

IMPORTANT: You must set a unique id and include three versions of the video you want to display to ensure cross browser compatibility.

File Formats

The full width slider uses html5 video and to ensure cross browser compatibility you will need to include the following file formats for your video:

- 1. mp4/m4v
- 2. webm
- 3. ogg

There are a bunch of free video converters that will allow you to convert your video to the required formats, one such converter is Easy HTML5 Video Converter (http://easyhtml5video.com/).

Go through each image and add the epicslider background video shortcode to the caption fields and make sure that 'Display Opt.' is set to 'Display in Featured Slider' as shown below.



NOTE: If only one image is set to 'Display in Featured Slider' the slider controls will be hidden and the slider will display a single slide. If more than one image is set to 'Display in Featured Slider' the slider and controls will be activated and serve as a regular slider. As with a regular full width slide

you can add captions. For caption styles and examples please see Full Width Media Caption Types & Examples. Once done, close the modal.

Step.4

Scroll down to the bottom of the editor and set page layout to 'Full-width Slider'.



Step.5

Click Publish. Repeat Step 1. to Step 5. to add additional slides.
